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## \*\*\*\*\*REQUIREMENTS FOR POSTER SESSIONS\*\*\*\*\*

1. Participants agree to display at least one poster and have at least one person available to answer questions on October 15, 2009.
2. Posters should be tended during conference breaks so that attendees may have an opportunity to discuss the material presented on the poster with the participant.
3. Posters should be informational or educational.
4. Posters may be on sturdy material such as foam board or may be presented as a table top display. Existing displays and/or posters are also welcome.
5. Participants are asked to bring their own easel to display their poster. If participant does not have an easel or a table top is needed, please contact Lori Gates at [lgates@cbbel-in.com](mailto:lgates@cbbel-in.com) or by calling (317)-266-8000.
6. Participants must set up their poster between 8:00 to 8:15a.m. before the conference begins on Thursday, October 15, 2009.
7.
